HIV and AIDS Surveillance in Pakistan

Since early 2000, an outbreak of HIV among Injecting Drug Users (IDUs) has changed the population health scenario in Pakistan and made the IDU population the source of the majority of reported cases of sexually transmitted infections.

Through second generation surveillance, which requires mapping of commercial sex workers and IDUs, estimates of these high risk groups in each city, along with the identification of the hot spots where they congregate, are providing a sampling frame for the next crucial step- integrated behavioral and biological surveillance (IBBS).
